The Academic Appeals Committee Minutes for May 17, 2010 were approved as submitted.

The Academic Appeals Committee met to review academic procedures for the 2010-2011 academic year. Below are definitions and procedures for reviewing academic appeals for the 2010-2011 academic year.

DEFINITIONS:

- Academic Good standing: Cumulative GPA $\geq$ 2.0
- Academic Probation: Cumulative GPA $<$ 2.0 for one semester
- Academic Suspension: Cumulative GPA $<$ 2.0 for two consecutive semesters
- Financial Aid standards of Academic Progress (SAP): Cumulative GPA $\geq$ 2.0 AND Cumulative Percent $\geq$ 67%

ACADEMIC PROBATION:

Students on academic probation should be awarded financial aid and notified that they will have one semester to bring cumulative GPA to 2.0 and percentage to 67%.

SUSPENDED STUDENTS:

1. All suspended students must appeal their academic suspension.
2. Students on first suspension, review with financial aid based on documented unusual circumstances. If they can reach a cumulative 2.0 GPA and 67% progression rate within 28 credit hours, two semesters; review based on documented unusual circumstances.
3. Students who are suspended for a second or third time, recommend denial unless they can attain a cumulative GPA of 2.0 or greater and a progression rate of 67% or more by two semesters. Students reinstated can take a maximum of 14 credit hours per semester. If they can reach a cumulative 2.0 GPA and 67% progression rate within 28 credit hours, two semesters; review based on documented unusual circumstances.
