ACADEMIC APPEALS COMMITTEE MEETING

The Academic Appeals Committee met to discuss rules, regulations, and correspondences.

Suspension Notice

The suspension notice was reviewed. The current suspension notice includes attempted hours in the message. Suspensions are determined by the cumulative GPA; therefore, it was determined that attempted hours does not need to be included in the suspension message.

Financial Aid

Financial aid dates were discussed. The dates were the dates utilized last year. The Assistant Director will check and verify dates for accuracy.

Students that received financial aid for fall and spring semesters are eligible for financial aid for Summer I, if they have funds remaining. Students enrolling in Summer II must appeal for financial aid. Summer II is the beginning of the new financial aid year.

Summer School

Students suspended after Spring 2010 may attend summer school, if they are enrolled in the current spring semester. Students not enrolled in the current spring semester, must appeal for summer school.

Academic Standing

Academic standings are determined at the end of fall and spring semesters. If a student is placed on academic suspension at the end of the spring semester he/she must appeal the suspension for reinstatement. If a student is placed on suspension and attends summer school and improves his/her GPA to a 2.0 or greater and improves his/her progression rate to 67% or more, he/she can return in the fall, if he/she has appealed his/her suspension. However, increasing the GPA to a 2.0 or greater does not change academic standing.

Students will not be automatically reviewed after summer semesters.
