

FSU/NCCC DUAL ENROLLMENT

WHAT IS DUAL ENROLLMENT?

Dual enrollment allows you to be enrolled at a North Carolina Community College and FSU at the same time. The “home” institution is your main institution for enrollment and financial aid purposes. The “host” institution is the other institution at which you will be taking classes. Generally the community college is your “home” institution until you earn 60 hours of transfer credits. Once you have earned 60 hours of transfer credit, you may apply for FSU to become your “home” institution.

CAN I TAKE CLASSES AT BOTH INSTITUTIONS DURING THE SAME SEMESTER?

Yes. Dual enrollment allows you to take classes at both institutions during the same semester. You may take classes up to the enrollment limit set by your home institution.

WILL FINANCIAL AID PAY FOR ALL MY CLASSES?

Yes, Financial Aid will pay for all your classes within your dual enrollment degree program. Your home institution will award your financial aid based on the cost of attendance and total enrolled hours at both institutions. Tuition and fees for both institutions will be paid before any refund is disbursed. If you will not be receiving financial aid, or if your financial aid is not sufficient to cover all your expenses, you will be responsible for clearing your account at both institutions directly.

HOW DO I BECOME DUALY ENROLLED?

You will need to complete the dual enrollment application form (you may get one from your department chair), and obtain the appropriate signatures from the community college and FSU. You will also need to complete a fee-waived admissions application for the host institution. The application and dual enrollment form must be submitted to the host institution’s Admissions Office prior to August 1 for the Fall semester, December 1 for the Spring semester, and May 1 for the Summer session.

HOW DO I KNOW WHICH COURSES TO TAKE?

You will receive a degree plan that will specify the courses required at each institution. You will also have an advisor at each institution. Prior to the established dual enrollment deadlines, you will need to see your advisor at your home institution to determine your classes for the next semester.

ARE THERE ANY OTHER REQUIREMENTS FOR DUAL ENROLLMENT?

If you meet the University's minimum admissions requirements (MARs), you are immediately eligible for dual enrollment. Otherwise, you will need to successfully complete all required developmental courses and at least six hours of transferable credit in each of the following subject areas: Mathematics, English, Natural Sciences, Social and Behavioral Sciences, and Foreign Languages.

WILL I HAVE TO ENROLL AT BOTH INSTITUTIONS EACH SEMESTER?

No, you only need to be enrolled in at least one course at either institution each semester (not including the summer session).
