- Of the 2008-09 graduates, the three most popular undergraduate majors were Criminal Justice (117), Psychology (116), and Business Administration (87).
- Of 23 graduate programs, the top three were Social Work (38), Education (32), and School Administration (31).

FACULTY AND STAFF

- 245 full-time teaching faculty (using CUPA- HR criteria) are employed as of October 1, 2009.
- 83% of full-time faculty members hold doctoral or first professional degrees.
- The average salary of a full-time faculty member is \$66,822 for men and \$69,848 for women.
- Student-to-faculty ratio is approximately 16 to 1.
