- Of the 2014-2015 graduates, the three most popular undergraduate majors were Bachelor of Science in Nursing (137), Bachelor of Science in Criminal Justice (125), and Bachelor of Science in Psychology (119).
- The top three master's programs were Master of Social Work (81), Master of Business Administration (21), and Master of School Administration (17).

FACULTY AND STAFF

- 255 full-time teaching faculty (using AAUP criteria) are employed as of October 1, 2015.
- 82% of full-time faculty members hold doctoral or first professional degrees.
- The average salary of a full-time faculty member is \$76,487 for men and \$74,989 for women.
- Student-to-faculty ratio is approximately 17 to 1.
