- Of the 2016-2017 graduates, the three most popular undergraduate majors were Bachelor of Science in Nursing (205), Bachelor of Science in Psychology (131), and Bachelor of Science in Business Administration (106).
- The top three master's programs were Master of Social Work (65), Master of Business Administration (40), and Master of Criminal Justice (19).

FACULTY AND STAFF (Preliminary)

- 266 full-time and 67 part-time teaching faculty (using AAUP criteria) are employed as of October 1, 2017.
- 170 faculty members are female and 163 are male.
- 218 faculty members are minorities and 115 are non-minorities.
- 80% of full-time faculty members hold doctoral or first professional degrees.
- The average salary of a full-time faculty member is \$81,106 for men and \$77,605 for women.
- Student-to-faculty ratio is approximately 15 to 1.
- 552 staff members (544 full-time and 8 part-time) are employed as of October 1, 2017.
- 345 staff members are females and 207 are males.
- 471 staff members are minorities and 81 are non-minorities.
