Block 4 FSU: 32 SHC

- These credits are awarded only after an RN student has successfully completed two initial nursing courses.
 - Validation of Previous Nursing Education: 32 hours after successful completion of NURS 300 and 320
 - HEED 112: Satisfied after completion of first nursing course.

Block 5 FSU: 34 SHC

- Consists of university-based courses that are taken as a part of the RN to BSN program.
 - The number of awarded credits in blocks 1 through 5 total 124 SHC
 - RN-BSN University courses as part of FSU's RN-BSN completion program
 - NURS 300, 320, 310, 325, 400, 411, 430, 450, 480, **and** 330 <u>or</u> 421
