Mehboob Khan

India's first Technicolor film, *Aan* is a swashbuckling adventure with lavish sets, dazzling costumes, and sensational musical numbers. The plot concerns a humble farmer who takes on an evil prince, stealing his princess and making her a proper woman--Taming of the Shrew fashion--along the way. Starring Dilip Kumar, Nadira, and Nimmi. In Hindi with English subtitles. India, 1952, 161 mins.

Sampooran Singh Gulzar

An ambitious politician (Suchitra Sen) finds her life torn between her fast-rising career and her marriage to a small-time hotel manager. Using flashbacks to show the couple's early years, the story follows what occurs when they are reunited as an important election looms. This film was rather controversial in India when first released because of the connections many saw between Suchitra Sen's character and Prime Minister Indira Gandhi. Hindi with English subtitles. Guru Dutt

Crime film elements, melodrama and the expected musical numbers are all worked seamlessly into this feature, one of the key films in the short but influential career of Guru Dutt. Dutt directs and stars in this story of a taxi driver who is fired from his job and becomes involved with a planned bank robbery. "Within its conventional framework of a light-hearted, entertaining film, *Aar Paar* was different...it brought with it a whiff of rebellion, a cheeky assertion of the existence of the post-independence worker, with different aspirations and the aggressive self-confidence of a new generation" (Shampa Banerjee, *Film India*). This remake of A Kiss Before Dying became quite controversial because the main star takes the role of a murderer, something quite rare in Hindi cinema. Baazigar is also notable for introducing a number of major young actors to the screen. With Rakhee, Shah Rukh Khan, Siddharth, Kajol and Shilpa Shetty. Music by Anu Malik. Bimal Roy

Considered by many to be director Bimal Roy's best film, *Bandini* remains a popular favorite and undisputed classic in India. An innocent village girl's life is changed forever when she becomes romantically involved with a married revolutionary. "A brilliantly shot film...there has rarely been a film with a greater number of memorable songs...a powerhouse performance by Nutan" (Indian Times). Deepa Mehta's second film in her elements trilogy (following the controversial *Fire*) is set during the 1947 partition of India and follows a young girl, her family, and their neighbors as they struggle to remain neutral when civil war explodes. A romantic rivalry and other matters of daily life are eventually engulfed in the violent conflicts between Hindus, Muslims and Sikhs. The film builds in intensity until reaching a powerful, unforgettable conclusion. Veteran Indian film actor Amitabh Bachchan stars as the noble Badshah Khan in his 85th film role. Khan meets the lovely Benazir (Sridevi) over a game of Buzkashi in Afghanistan, but before he can marry her, he must go to India and avenge Benazir's father's death. Guru Dutt

Although his life and career were cut tragically short by his 1964 suicide, Guru Dutt was a

pivotal figure in Indian cinema history. An actor, writer, director and producer, he tried to merge the romantic entertainment of India's popular cinema with personal statements about creativity and the changing social situation in the country. Autobiographical touches are not hard to find in *Kaagaz Ke Phool*, in which Dutt plays a successful director whose career plummets, while his comeback depends upon the famous actress (Waheeda Rehman) he discovered. "...a sensitive creation of an artist who is in the throes of inner conflict, an artist who fights against the storms and ironies of life" (Manoj Srivastava, *Hindustan Times*). It's a deliberately old-fashioned crowd-pleaser, set in British-controlled India of the late 19th century. The beleaguered residents of a small village must contend with a severe drought and an increasingly high lagaan (tax) demanded by their oppressive rulers. One heroic villager challenges the lagaan and earns the chance to free his people from the burden, but only if his team can win a cricket match against the

Brits. Severely overmatched in a game they do not know, they try to achieve a seemingly impossible victory. Indian box-office idol Aamir Khan stars and also produced. A fast-paced entertainment that seems far shorter than its epic running time. Hindi and English with English subtitles; India, 2001, 224 mins.

Shyam Benegal

The prostitutes of a brothel find themselves up against politicians who use morality as the selling point in a scheme to get the brothel's land. "Benegal uses the bordello as an instrument to satirize middle class respectability but it has its own secrets and repressed passions. A bittersweet, magical fable about a frustrated writer propelled to celebrity via an unexpected talent as a healer and masseuse. Set in an Indian community in 1950's Trinidad, the film allows a rare insight into the warmth and humor of the human condition. "Rich and absorbing! Subtle, humorous, illuminating" (Stephen Holden, The New York Times).

Mohan Segal

The bane of provincialism and the caste system is addressed in this influential Indian feature. A young Punjabi man finds doors closed to him when he comes to New Delhi and finally masquerades as a Tamilian in order to obtain shelter. Staying with a Tamilian family, he falls in love with the beautiful daughter, but is unable to reveal his true identity. Although the film is generally romantic and hopeful, the issues it raised were quite controversial for an "entertainment" at the time. Music by Shankar Jaikishan. In Hindi with English subtitles. B.R. Chopra

This film by B.R. Chopra focuses on love and divorce. Nilofer (Salma Agha) knew, loved, and married only one man. But her husband, aspiring architect Waseem (Deepak Parashar) takes her for granted, and in a fit of anger divorces her. While attempting to rebuild her life as a writer, Nilofer bumps into her old college friend and admirer Haider (Raj Babbar), who is now an editor. Haider publishes her work and takes on the role of friend, philosopher, and guide. Soon the two are happily married, until Waseem returns, repentant and wanting his wife back. The film's music produced many classic hits in India. In Hindi with English subtitles. India, 1982.

It is the epic story of the destruction of a fishing village on the banks of the River Titas. "Ghatak depicts the rhythm of the fishermen's small world in a style which blends the lyrical with the documentary, and intersperses episodes from the sad lives of various characters" (Derek Malcolm, British Film Institute). Mohanlal and Suhasini, top stars of Indian cinema, are featured in this film shot by ace cinematographer Renato Berta, who has worked with Amos Gitai, Jean-Luc Godard, Manoel de Oliveira, Alain Resnais and Eric Rohmer, among others.
