Student Assistants are responsible for providing support to UTS staff in the daily operations of the unit. 4. (PAL) Peer Academic Leader Program. The PAL program at Fayetteville State University is designed to provide activities and services for freshmen that encourage balancing academic, social, family, and personal responsibilities through peer academic advising and mentoring. strives to empower the freshmen so that they can make a successful transition from high school to college or from the work place to college. Each student selected to participate in the program will be assigned as a PAL to 20-30 students enrolled in one Freshman Seminar class. Throughout the year, the peer academic leader will meet with his or her Freshman Seminar class during one regularly-scheduled class meeting each week. These meetings will enable PALs to get to know the freshmen in their groups, and to answer questions freshmen have as they adjust to university life. This in-class contact will help the freshmen feel comfortable to contact their PALs outside of class when they have problems or questions. To serve as a PAL, you must have the desire to help other students, and need to have positive feelings about Fayetteville State University. Peer Academic Leaders will be required to attend a training workshop prior to the beginning of the fall semester, and several subsequent meetings during the academic year.

8. Student in Free Enterprise

A student in Free Enterprise (SIFE) is sponsored by the corporate sector, which includes many major and medium size companies such as Wal Mart, Best Buy, Exxon/Mobile, Sears Roebuck Inc etc. The purpose of the SIFE program is to provide business and non-business college students with an opportunity to develop team building, communication, organizational and leadership skills through learning, practicing and teaching.

Process

Corporations announce at the beginning of each year their themes, set contest rules, and monetary rewards which range from \$500-\$5,000. This information is sent by the SIFE Headquarter to all the university campuses that have SIFE teams. The SIFE faculty advisor on each campus invites students to form teams to work on each theme. The teams may create and design any project(s) that best address the themes. These projects could be local, community or campus based or even international. At the end of the academic year, the SIFE teams write a newsletter summarizing the number and nature of the projects implemented, and the number of people reached/served during the academic year.

Contest

The SIFE teams from different universities enter into regional competition that is generally held in Charlotte. Each SIFE teams presents it projects to a panel of judges that consists of plant managers, successful entrepreneurs, and business leaders within the region. Each SIFE team is given 20 minutes to showcase its projects by making a multi-media presentation in front of the judges who read the newsletter and ask questions. The panel of judges selects regional winners who are then invited to enter their projects in the national competition in Kansas. Upon winning the national competition, SIFE teams may enter the international competition in London
