

TENURE TRACK ASSISTANT PROFESSOR OF ARABIC

Applicants must have a PhD in a foreign language and the credentials required by the Southern Association of College and Schools to teach Arabic at the college level: at least 18 graduate credit hours in Arabic. The successful candidate must demonstrate native or near-native fluency in Arabic, a record of teaching excellence, and evidence of active scholarship. Ability to teach French is highly desirable, but is not required. ABDs may apply, but only individuals who can reasonably expect to have their doctoral degree completed by Fall 2011 will be considered. MA holders may be considered for a fixed term non-tenure-track faculty position. The position start date is August 1, 2011 and applications will be reviewed until the position is filled. Those applications received before December 15, 2010 will be given full consideration. Salary is highly competitive.
