"An Empirical Investigation of Accepted Financial Condition Measures Among Counties in the Impact Area of the BRAC" (On-Going)
Examine the affected counties' ability to meet their short-term financial obligations and their prospects of continuing to provide services to their citizens in the near future.

"How are Public School Construction Projects being Financed in the BRAC Region" (On-Going)
It is believed that the BRAC will introduce approximately 40,000 additional persons into the eleven-county region designated as the BRAC Region. Among this influx of people will be approximately 16,000 new workers, both active-duty military and civilian; so, that among the remaining 24,000 individuals, there will be a need for public school services. Some of the public school districts will find it necessary to build additional facilities. Since this influx of people results from actions of the federal government, how much of the finances of constructing new public school facilities will be borne by the federal government?

"Impact of American Recovery and Revitalization Act Funds on Programs of the Kinston Community Health Center" (On-Going)
A case study of the receipt and utilization of stimulus funds for programs and services offered by the Kinston Community Health Center in Eastern North Carolina.

"The Impact of ARRA Funding on Healthcare Services in North Carolina" (Writing Results)
Various Health Center Grantee in North Carolina have been awarded approximately \$33.3 million for New Access Point Services, Increased Demand for Services, Capital Improvement Construction Programs, and Health Information Technology. The grantees have reported an increase in their number of employees while providing services to additional insured and uninsured patients.
