

DID YOU KNOW THAT ...

- ✚ You must maintain at least a 2.5 GPA to be admitted into and retained in teacher education programs?
- ✚ You must declare your major on-line after completing 45 credits?
- ✚ You must complete an application to be admitted to teacher education?
- ✚ You must apply to and be admitted to student teaching the semester before you intend to student teach?
- ✚ You must pass the three sections of PRAXIS I (Math =173; Writing =173; Reading =176 or a Composite of 522) to be admitted to teacher education?
- ✚ Plato software is available, in Butler 209, to assist enrolled students with preparing for PRAXIS I?
- ✚ You must complete field and practicum experiences as a requirement for select education courses?
- ✚ If you have an undergraduate degree in a content area and decide you would like to be licensed to teach secondary education in the area of your degree you may pursue a master's degree through the Master of Arts in Teaching (MAT) program and secure licensure at the Master's level?
- ✚ You have the opportunity to participate in a Summer Pilot Project program and receive financial assistance (if you qualify) and graduate earlier than intended? See <http://www.uncfsu.edu/soe/>
- ✚ You must apply to the registrar for an official audit once you have earned 90 credit hours?
- ✚ If you attempt 180 credits you are no longer eligible for financial aid?
- ✚ If you are a sophomore you should have earned at least 30 credits; 60 if you are a junior; 90 if you are a senior?
- ✚ You have the right to meet with your advisor at least twice per semester?
- ✚ If you are a secondary education student you have two advisors, one in the content area and one in education?
- ✚ If you are majoring in Middle Grades you must have selected two concentration areas. If not, you have not completed the process?
- ✚ There are information sessions each semester to talk with students? (Check with your Chairperson for the next scheduled meeting.)
