Title III Funds Grant to Increase Production of STEM Prepared Teachers and Business Leaders

Fayetteville State University's College of Education, College of Business and Economics and College of Arts and Sciences were awarded the HBCU Master's Degree Program Grant by the U. S. Department of Education. The HBCU Master's degree program will strengthen and improve graduate education at Fayetteville State University by providing financial assistance, internships/apprenticeships, academic and non-academic assistance and support to African American and low-income students in graduate level science, math, information technology and allied health disciplines. The intent is to: (1) increase their enrollment, persistence, progression and graduation; (2) provide research and professional development opportunities for both faculty and students; (3) establish one new degree program and several new concentrations; and (4) establish student and program support services to ensure program implementation and the achievement of the goals and objectives. This is a six-year award in the amount of \$416K per year.
