COMMITTEE ON BUDGET AND FINANCE

The Committee on Budget and Finance of the Fayetteville State University Board of Trustees convened Wednesday, December 11, 2024, in the Rudolph Jones Center Room 242 and via Microsoft Teams. Committee Chair Stuart Augustine presided and called the meeting to order at 1:15 p.m.

ROLL CALL

The following Trustee Committee members were in attendance: Mr. Stuart Augustine, Mr. Will Warner, Mr. Donald Moore, and Dr. Kimberly Jeffries Leonard.

Staff persons in attendance were Chancellor Darrell Allison, AVC Kenny Spayd, AVC Michelle Donegain, AVC Sandra Williams, AVC (Interim) Gene Cottrell, VC Wanda Jenkins.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Trustee Will Warner motioned to approve the minutes of the Committee on Budget and Finance meeting held on September 25, 2024, as distributed. Trustee Kimberly Jeffries Leonard seconded the motion. The motion carried.

CAPITAL PROJECTS AND MAJOR/MINOR RENOVATIONS UPDATES

Mr. Kenny Spayd, Associate Vice Chancellor of Finance, presented updates on several construction and capital projects.

New Residence Hall: The new residence hall is on target to be completed in summer 2025. The building will house 336 additional beds on campus. Debt to be issued in April/May 2025.

Health and Wellness Center: The project is on track for a January 2026 completion. The 24,631 square foot center will house student health services and campus wellness. AVC Spayd provided a bid day update.

New College of Education: Site work for the project began in October 2024 and the bid opens on December 12, 2024. The project's estimated completion is set for Summer 2026.

New Parking Deck: The University is seeking an additional \$1million to add a third level to supply an additional 55 spaces. The estimated completion is in 2026.

Starbucks: Starbucks will open mid-January 2025.

Chick Building: The construction documents for this renovation are in progress and will be submitted to State Construction in April 2025. The bid process will be over summer 2025 with a completion in 2026.

Rosenthal: The design development for this renovation is in progress and will be submitted to State Construction in Spring 2025. The estimated completion of the renovation is in 2027.

Cook Building: Advanced planning is coming to an end for this renovation. The estimated completion is in 2026.

An overview of the following minor renovations was presented: phase 1 of the electronic door access project, the East Quad hardscape and lighting work, The continuing education renovations, and the Spaulding building renovation. Additionally, \$2 million in repair and renovation funding was authorized for FSU during the November Board of Governors meeting. This funding will be used to replace fire alarms, sewer lines, building pneumatic controls, repair air handlers and many other items across campus. Trustee William Warner asked about the \$1 million-dollar additional funds? AVC Spayd shared some of the projects that will be with the R&R dollars. \$250,000 has been set aside for utilities relocations for the parking debt project. Additional projects include replacing HVAC equipment, fire alarms and control panels, and air handlers in several buildings.

BUDGET UPDATE

State Funded Operations: Through November, the University has expended 40.3% of its state funded operating budget (lower than last Nov). Expenses are in line with earlier projections. The University is tracking for a budget surplus.

Auxiliary Outlook: Through November, approximately 45.6% of the budget has been expended. The University is on pace for a budget surplus.

ADJOURNMENT

The Committee on Budget and Finance adjourned at approximately 1:31 p.m.

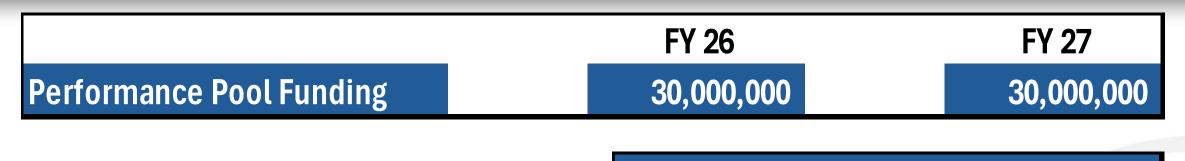

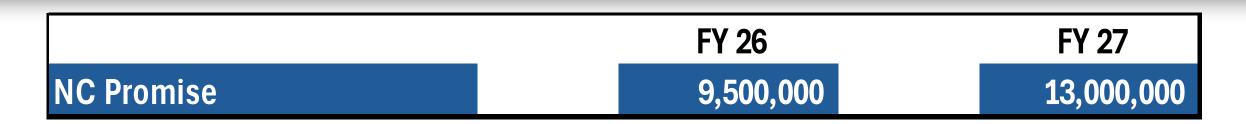


- The maximum a University can earn is based upon their proportionate share of FTE students. For FSU, the maximum funding amount to be gained or lost is **\$826K**.
- FSU is slated to receive **\$745K** in additional funding in FY 2026

- For the current year, NC Promise institutions grew enrollment at a pace that, for the first time, did not keep pace with the increase in NC Promise funding.
- This request closes the current year funding gap and provides funding for expected enrollment increases in the next two fiscal years.
- FSU's portion of the current year funding gap approximates \$1.6M

- Eligible students would receive up to \$1,000 per academic semester.

 - Design Development in progress submit to State Construction in Spring 2025
 - Complete during 1H2027

 - Ended Advance Planning, moving to Design Development stage.
 - Eligible for OSBM flexibility funding, to mitigate potential inflationary increases.
 - Complete during 2H2026



ACTION ITEM – SPAULDING RENOVATION PROJECT AUTHORITY INCREASE (BF-1)

- **Background**: The University has project authority for a \$1.3 million renovation of the Spaulding building. This building will be the home of Student Disability Services and Student Counseling.
- **Issue:** Our most recent estimate indicates the current project scope will cost \$1.62M.
- Action Taken: Furniture and moving costs have been taken out of the project scope and will be funded from other sources. After this action, the project is overbudget by \$150K.
- Motion: Recommend approval to the Full Board to increase the Spaulding renovation project authority by \$150 thousand to \$1.45 million with Student Health Services Fees.



ACTION ITEM – NEW RESIDENCE HALL AUTHORITY TO ISSUE DEBT (BF-2)

- **Background**: In December 2023, the Board approved increasing the project authority for the New Residence Hall from \$44M to \$50M and approved the University to fund the additional \$6M of project authority using self-liquidating debt authority.
- **Issue:** The project will exhaust the original \$44M in funding in early May.
- The University held a competitive RFP process and received responses from nine banks.

BACKGROUND:	Board of Trustees approval is required for new capital projects or additions in construction project budget authority for previously approved projects. The Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund (HEERF) funded FSU Spaulding Renovation project authority of \$1,300,000 was approved by the FSU Board of Trustees in June 2023.

New Residence Hall Project: Authority to Issue Special Obligation Bonds

In July 2022, the North Carolina General Assembly passed S.L. 2022-74, appropriating \$40 million for the construction of a new residence hall.

Subsequently, the North Carolina Office of State Budget and Management approved an additional \$4,000,000 in project authority for the New Residence Hall project in April of 2023 bringing the total project authority to \$44,000,000.

TATEAn additional \$6,000,000 in project authority, to be

financed via self-liquidating debt, was approved by the Board of Trustees in December of 2023. It was subsequently approved by the Board of Governors in April 2024 and approved by the legislature through S.L. 2024-24

After a competitive process, the University has awarded the debt issuance to PNC, to provide a seven-year term at a fixed rate of 3.59%. This rate was locked on March 14, 2025. The deal is scheduled to close on April 30th, 2025, contingent on Board of Trustees and Board of Governors approval.

RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF FAYETTEVILLE STATE UNIVERSITY APPROVING THE ISSUANCE OF SPECIAL OBLIGATION BONDS

WHEREAS, under Article 3, Section 116D General Statutes of North Carolina (the "Act") the Board of Governors (the "Board of Governors") of the University of North Carolina (the "University") may issue special obligation bonds, payable from obligated resources to pay the costs of acquiring, constructing or providing special obligation bond projects at one of the constituent institutions of the University or refunding any obligations previously issued by the Board of Governors;

WHEREAS, Fayetteville State University ("FSU") has requested that the Board of Governors issue its special obligation bonds (the "Bonds"), the proceeds of which will be applied by FSU, together with other available funds, for the construction of a new residence hall as authorized by S.L. 2024-24 of the 2023 Session Laws of the North Carolina General Assembly (the "Special Obligation Bond Project");

WHEREAS, Section 116D-26(b) of the Act requires the Board of Trustees of FSU to approve the issuance of the Bonds for the Special Obligation Bond Project;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of Fayetteville State University as follows:

Section 1. *Approval of Issuance of the Bonds.* The issuance of the Bonds for the Special Obligation Bond Project is approved.

Section 2. *Documents Authorized.* The Chairman of the Board of Trustees, the Chancellor and the Vice Chancellor for Finance and Administration, individually or collectively, are hereby authorized, empowered and directed to do any and all other acts and to execute any and all documents, which they, in their discretion, deem necessary and appropriate in order to consummate the issuance of the Bonds and the transactions contemplated by this Resolution.

Section 3. *Effective Date.* This Resolution is effective immediately.
