COMMITTEE ON UNIVERSITY ADVANCEMENT

The Committee on University Advancement of the Fayetteville State University Board of Trustees convened Wednesday, June 11, 2025, in the Rudolph Jones Student Center, Multi-purpose Room 242 and via Microsoft Teams. The meeting was called to order by Trustee Gregory Pinnix at 11:09 a.m.

ROLL CALL

The following trustees were in attendance: Mr. Jerry Gregory, Mrs. Joyce Adams, Mr. Warren McDonald, and Dr. Kimberly Jeffries Leonard.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

It was moved by Trustee Warren McDonald and seconded by Trustee Joyce Adams that the minutes of the Committee on University Advancement Meeting held on March 26, 2025, be accepted, as printed. The motion carried.

UNIVERSITY ADVANCEMENT UPDATES

Mrs. Sandy Yates, Associate Vice Chancellor for Development, provided an update on fundraising engagement.

The year-to-date (YTD) total fundraising comparison reflected revenue totaling a little over \$6 million as of May 20, 2025, compared to \$3.7 million in FY24. Total commitments at the time were \$5.1 million compared to \$1.5 million in FY24.

Additionally, faculty and staff giving totaled \$53,770 this fiscal year compared to \$47,864 in FY24. Advancement staff continue to work towards gaining the trust of university internal constituents. Thus, the increase in the giving total for FY25.

AVC Yates provided an update on the new senior giving initiative launched during Spring Commencement, which encouraged graduating seniors to donate in exchange for a special FSU alumni cord. The cord symbolized their first gift to FSU. The students were especially recognized during the induction into the FSU National Alumni Association (FSUNAA) at commencement. One hundred and fifty (150) graduate donors gave a total of \$2,745. AVC Yates recognized Mrs. Linda Coley, FSUNAA President, for her efforts and invited her to share comments. As these efforts are continued, an increase in senior contributions will be sought. Trustee Kimbery Jeffries-Leonard commented that giving the cords was a brilliant idea and asked if all Trustees could also receive a cord. Trustee Jerry Gregory concurred the cords were a good idea.

Overall, alumni giving has continued to increase, underscoring the diligent work of the university advancement team. Growth over the last two fiscal years show:

- In FY23, alumni donors totaled 1,233 (4.4%).
- In FY24, alumni donors increased to 1,475 (5.3%).
- Thus far for FY25, over 1,920 (7%) alumni donors have given—which will exceed this year's strategic goal of 7%.

At the conclusion of the update, Ms. Coley thanked the Trustees for their support and encouraged them to continue giving back to FSU.

Fiscal Year 2025 concluded with record-breaking fundraising results. Total contributions reached ~\$9.8M – the highest amount in university history.










UNIVERSITY ADVANCEMENT STATUS REPORT

*YTD26: 1,283 at 4.6%





UNIVERSITY ADVANCEMENT STATUS REPORT

Endowment funding grew to ~\$39.2M ensuring long-term stability and financial support for student scholarships, faculty development, and academic programs.




Endowment GrowthLast 3 Years




YEAR-TO-DATE COMPARISONS
