Career Summary

Xiaochen Hu (Ph.D.) is an Associate Professor in the Department of Criminal Justice at Fayetteville State University (FSU) in Fayetteville, NC, U.S. He earned a B.S. in Applied Psychology from Nanjing Normal University in China, and an M.S. in Criminal Justice from the University of Cincinnati.
