Each year, you <u>must</u> complete the **Free Application For Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)** to apply for financial aid. The FAFSA application becomes available on October 1st at

https://studentaid.gov/h/apply-for-aid/fafsa

To complete the FAFSA, and log into all Federal Student Aid websites, the student and parent must have a Federal Student Aid (FSA) ID. To create your FSA ID, please log onto **fsaid.ed.gov**.



The maximum loans a graduate student can receive within the academic year is **\$20,500 in unsubsidized loans**.

• For financial aid purposes, a student must be enrolled at least half-time (4.5 credits) to receive Federal Direct loans.




