- Of 23 master's programs, the top three were Social Work (61), Education (31), and Business Administration (21).

FACULTY AND STAFF

- 278 full-time teaching faculty (using AAUP criteria) are employed as of October 1, 2010.
- 82% of full-time faculty members hold doctoral or first professional degrees.
- The average salary of a full-time faculty member is \$72,944 for men and \$67,510 for women.
- Student-to-faculty ratio is approximately 16 to 1.
