The application for Clinical Experience (Student Teaching) must be submitted the semester before the clinical experience (EDUC 692 & EDUC 697) is anticipated. Candidates who are not currently employed as a Residency Licensure teacher must be placed in a public-school classroom by the College of Education's Office of Teacher Education.
