- April of 2020 I was told I had one class left and I would graduate in December. Come to find out in December when I paid to graduate I was then told I actually had three more classes. Very displeased seeing as how it was not budgeted in. And I wasted a whole semester on only once class when I could have done all 4.
- At the time I left FSU Professor Barbra Russo was in charge of many of my classes. She was hostile and I felt I was not being treated fairly. Therefore I left FSU until I was informed she no longer teaches for FSU. Once I heard this I contacted my advisor and was readmitted as a student. I have thoroughly enjoyed the program since returning.
- Changing major, being part time for personal reasons, and taking time off for personal reasons were all equally as important. Consider changing the survey item listing 'working for pay' to reflect non-paid domestic labor, especially in light of increased hours parents are spending attending to their children's education.
- Classes offered once a semester and I was in a car accident that left me mentally unstable.

- I took 2 semesters off in between transferring to FSU for personal reasons to figure out what I wanted To study. When transferred not all my credits transferred and I need More math classes.

- I took a lot of pre-nursing and extra biotechnology class to have on my transcript.
