The Title IX Office Is Here For You!

The Title IX Office is responsible for supporting all members of the FSU community and can provide support and resources **even if you do not want to file a complaint. We can help with:**

- ✓ Obtaining supportive measures such as academic assistance, housing adjustments, and No Contact Orders.
- ✓ Facilitating informal resolutions, as appropriate.
- ✓ Filing a police report or a Formal Complaint with the University.
- ✓ Connecting with on and off campus resources.

Mandatory Reporters

While we encourage everyone to report Title IX incidents, **University administrators at the level of director/department chair or above with knowledge of prohibited sexual conduct MUST report such incidents to the Title IX Coordinator, and University Police (if a crime is involved)**. Other employees/students should also report their knowledge of such incidents to the Title IX Coordinator and or University Police. No employee/student is authorized to investigate or attempt to resolve an incident. Additional information about Mandatory Reporters can be found in the FSU Policy on Prohibited Sexual Conduct.
