IT security, which is short for information technology security, is the practice of protecting the university's IT assets—computer systems, networks, digital devices, data—from unauthorized access, data breaches, cyberattacks and other malicious activities.

Three Reasons to not share passwords

- Sharing passwords is against university policy.
 - All students and employees are subject to the Acceptable Use Policy, which prohibits password sharing. Keeping passwords secure and not sharing accounts is essential. Providing access to another individual, whether deliberately or by failing to secure it, is prohibited.
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- Shared passwords expose everyone to vulnerabilities.
 - Your password and account could be exploited to launch phishing attacks or scams targeting others within the university. Most security breaches are caused by a combination of technical vulnerabilities and human errors, including password sharing
