Protection of Minors on Campus (PMOC)

Fayetteville State University welcomes the presence of minors who participate in a wide range of activities, research programs, camps, and events offered by various academic and administrative units operated by University-Sponsored or by third parties who use Fayetteville State University property and facilities.

The Office of Risk and Compliance oversees the [Protection of Minors on Campus Policy](#) (Policy). This policy establishes standards and procedures that provide appropriate protection and supervision of minors. The purpose of the PMOC policy and procedures is to create a welcoming and safe environment for all minors visiting University property or participating in University programs.

Summer Camps Season:

As Fayetteville State University prepares for the 2025 Summer Camp Season, PMOC is committed to ensuring a safe experience for all minors visiting our beautiful campus. All summer camps must register with the PMOC Office before submitting any scheduling requests through the 25Live system.

Registering a Program:

The University requires all Covered programs to be registered and approved by the Office of Risk and Compliance: Protection of Minors on Campus office. Covered programs must register at least 60 days before the program start date. All covered programs that are continuously or periodically operating must re-register and be approved annually. Failure to do so may result in the cancellation of programming.

One Day Programs Registrations:

The one-day program registration form is now available for all programs that will host minors for a single day event. The program manager is responsible for ensuring compliance with university policies and completing the PMOC Training. Please submit this form to compliance@uncfsu.edu.

Other Requirements:

Adults, students, and volunteers working with the program must complete the training requirements before working with minors. Adults that will work directly with minors must successfully complete a criminal background check, including a sex-offender registry check, prior to being authorized to work with minors. Please note that this process may take up to two weeks.
