Notice is being provided to the campus community in regard to a crime that occurred on Matthews St. near Murchison Rd. on December 1, 2024, at approximately 1:15 a.m. Reports of shots fired in the area of Matthews St. causing damage to property on Murchison Rd. Upon investigation by both the Fayetteville Police Department shell casings were located. No injuries have been reported at this time.

This case remains under investigation by the Fayetteville Police Department.
