On Campus – Breaking/Entering, Larceny "See Something, Say Something"

Notice is being provided to the campus community in regard to a crime that occurred on campus at the listed buildings on January 27<sup>th</sup>, 2025, at approximately 9:30 a.m. to 10:43 a.m. A report of larceny was received by the police department and investigation determined that Douglas Edward Epps was on campus after previously being trespassed from Fayetteville State University property. Epps has been charged and convicted multiple times in the past for Breaking and Entering, Larceny, Financial Card Theft, and Financial Card Fraud. Epps continues to come back to the property after being banned to commit more crimes of the same nature. During his time on campus, he has had face-to-face contacts with several students, staff and faculty.

## **UPDATE:**

On February 3, 2025, Fayetteville State University Dispatch received a call from a parent advising that a suspicious subject was observed on campus. Based on the description provided, dispatchers were able to locate the subject in the Rudolph Jones Student Center. Douglas Edward Epps was apprehended in the Student Center and arrested by Fayetteville State University by Police and Public Safety without incident.

It was later determined that the parent received a copy of the photo sent out by FSU News Campus Community Advisory from her student. We would like to thank all of those involved in making this arrest. Your swift actions are a testament to the dedication and commitment we should all pursue in ensuring the safety of our campus community.
