Notice is being provided to the campus community in regard to a crime that occurred on Coley Dr. today. On 01/4/24 at approximately 12:50 p.m., A shot was fired in the area of Coley Dr near Council St. Upon investigation by both the Fayetteville State University Police and Public Safety and the Fayetteville Police Department one shell casing was located and a possible victim, off campus. No injuries are reported. Fayetteville Police Department along with the Fayetteville State University Police and Public Safety are investigating this crime. There is limited suspect information at this time, however, the suspect was last seen running away from campus North on Coley Dr. He is described as a black male wearing all black armed with a handgun.

This case is being investigated by the Fayetteville Police Department.
