Notice is being provided to the campus community of an alleged crime reported to have occurred on the Fayetteville State University Campus. We are sending this message in order for you:

- To protect yourself and others in our community
- To notify you that there may be a threat to the campus
- To help us with the investigation of possible crimes

On February 26, 2020 at 9:12pm the Fayetteville State University Police and Public Safety was notified of a reported robbery on campus. Two (2) students were approached by two black males near the fountain at Bryant Hall. The students were shown a handgun and robbed at gun point. One of the student's cellphone and a financial card was taken. The two black males suspects fled on foot towards Murchison Road.

Fayetteville Police Department also received a report of two students being robbed at Seabrook Park (Off Campus) on Langdon Street after the first report to Fayetteville State University Police and Public Safety.

It is believed both incidents were committed by the same suspects.

The incidents are being investigated by both Fayetteville State University Police and Public Safety and Fayetteville Police Department.

The suspects are described as:

Suspect #1: Black male wearing black jacket, black shorts and red shoes.

Suspect #2: Black male wearing a black hoodie and grey pants. He was in possession of a

dark colored handgun.
