Reported Crime: Shots fired and Vehicle Crash

Location: 1200 Block of Murchison Road (near University Place Apartments)

Notice is being provided to the campus community of an alleged crime reported to have occurred near the Fayetteville State University Campus. We are sending this message for you:

- To protect yourself and others in our community
- To notify you that there may be a threat to or near the campus
- To help us with the investigation of possible crimes

On March 7, 2019 at approximately 12:15 pm the Fayetteville Police Department was notified of an alleged incident involving vehicles that occurred in another area of the City of Fayetteville. Fayetteville Police Department then responded to a report of a vehicle crash in the 1200 block of Murchison Road near University Place Apartments. During Fayetteville Police Department's investigation, it was determined that there were two vehicles involved in traffic crashes and shots were fired from one of the crashed vehicles. Fayetteville Police Department has identified a suspect who is in custody and not affiliated with Fayetteville State University. Fayetteville State University Police and Public Safety responded to the area of University Place Apartments to assist Fayetteville Police Department in their investigation.
