The Fayetteville State University Police and Public Safety Department is providing this notice to the campus community regarding a reported crime that occurred on campus at Hackley Honors Hall on August 29, 2026, at approximately 2:47 am. University police officers responded to a report that several non-student males unlawfully entered Hackley Honors Hall and entered a student’s room. Once inside, the individuals reportedly assaulted a male non-student who was visiting the room and stole property belonging to him. All parties involved in the incident are known to one another.

The Fayetteville State University Police and Public Safety Department is actively investigating this incident. Additional information will be provided to the campus community as appropriate and as the investigation permits.

Members of the campus community are reminded to remain aware of their surroundings, secure residence hall doors, and immediately report suspicious activity to University Police.
