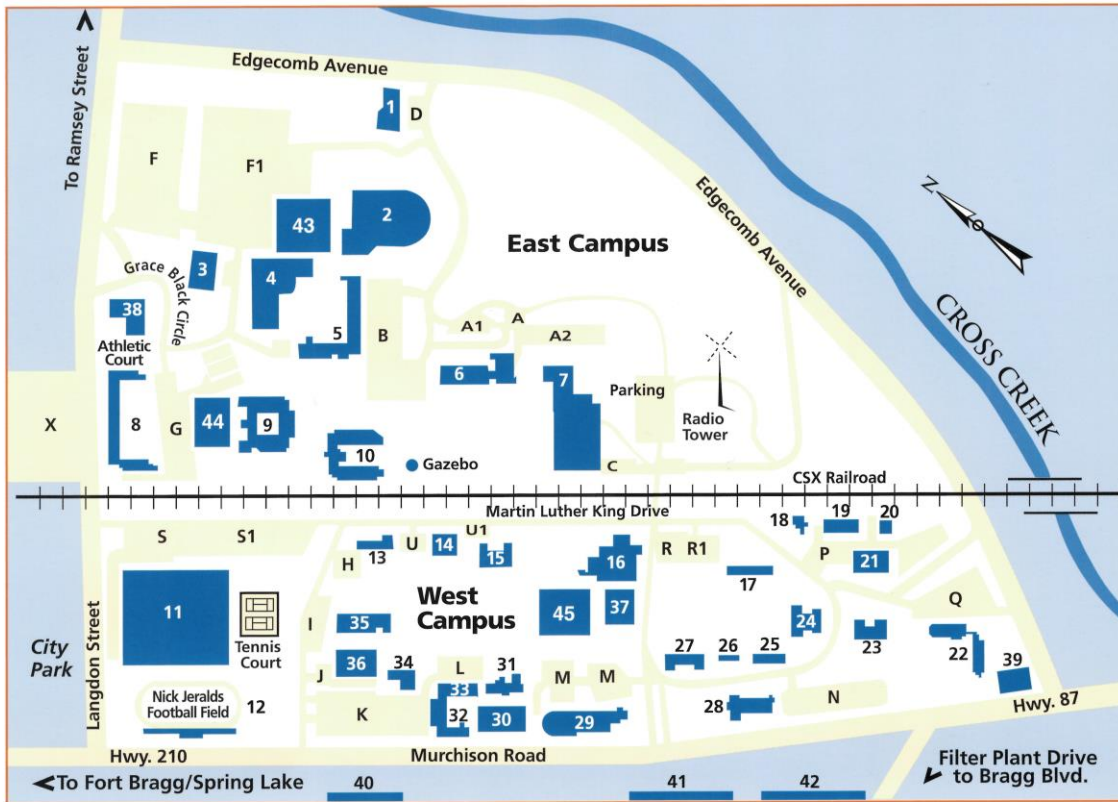

Supplemental Instruction (SI) is provided in some classes at Fayetteville State University and is a method of academic support that has proven effective in improving student academic success in courses with traditionally high dropout and withdrawal rates. In this program, SI Leaders provide three, one-hour sessions of academic support each week from trained individuals that are eager to assist.

Since the SI Leader attends class, he or she knows what the course instructor has covered in class. SI Leaders reinforce the knowledge and skills required by the class.

The Strengthening STEM Student Success (S4) Program is a federally National Science Foundation funded grant program that focuses on supporting undergraduate STEM-major students. The overall goal of the program is to increase enrollment and completion of students in STEM degrees based on evidence of promise or "what works" initiative. Students work one on one with a faculty mentor to conduct a research project. STEM students receive tutoring for subjects in select entry level STEM courses at no cost. Advanced students can work as a peer tutor or a learning assistant in the classroom. This opportunity allows advanced STEM students to review concepts from previous courses while helping other students to succeed. S4 provides tutoring for the following courses:
