- 3 MATH 121 may be required based on profile scores. Some core courses require a one-hour lab.
- 4 At least one natural science class must include its associated lab.
- 5 Not required for students with 30 or more transfer credits from a foreign institution. Students do not earn credit if requirement is waived.
- 6 The course selected must also be used to satisfy another Core requirement. The credits count only once.

#### Other Program Requirements

1. A student must have a GPA of 2.0 or higher to declare Sociology as a major.
2. The Sociology major must complete a comprehensive departmental examination in the senior year.
3. A student must attain a grade of "C" or better in all Sociology courses for graduation. A grade of "C" or better must be maintained in the courses that are needed for the minor, electives, or concentration.
4. An overall GPA of 2.0 or higher is required to graduate.
